# TANDEM CDN-NDG

The city of Montreal's citizen's program for urban security since 1982



**The Tandem team**, whose work covers the entire borough of Côte-des-Neiges – Notre-Dame-de-Grâce, is mandated with offering citizens both individual and collective strategies to reduce the risk of becoming victims of crime as well as to increase their feelings of security both personally and as a community.

## **TANDEM primarily focuses on the three following themes:**

### **People's personal security:**

through information sessions to women, safety audits, workshops on safety in public spaces, stranger awareness for youth aged 6-12.

### **Safety of people's personal property:**

Safety of people's personal property through home security evaluations, engraving of personal property, or fraud prevention workshops.

### **Security for communities at large:**

Work in the so-called vulnerable sectors, working with citizens' groups, and illegal tagging issues. More popular subjects include internet safety, cyberbullying, safety in public spaces, public transportation safety, fraud prevention, as well as others.

## **TANDEM in 2020:**



### **The Path Less Taken:**

The Tandem Prevention CDN-NDG project, The Path Less Taken is a silent short film funded by the Government of Canada through its senior programs. The film's objective is to prevent and raise awareness of various situations of psychological abuse, neglect, ageism, financial fraud, and systemic abuse.

## REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

- More than 525 sensitized by door to door visits to apartments
- More than 50 apartment buildings were assisted with gaining access to recycling bins
- 500 compost buckets and 60 small recycling bins were replaced or repaired the Éco Quartier Office
- More than 335 large compost bins and 105 recycling bins were verified by courtesy tickets
- 2 community composting sites were put in place, avoiding throwing more than 250 kg of food waste in the garbage and generating more than 60 pounds of mulch which was offered to residents.
- Provided training to parents of green committees on: responsible management of residual materials and the organization of Zero Waste events/activities in NDG schools;
- Supported the CSDM team in monitoring the management of residual materials in a few neighborhood schools: assessment of the inventory, recommendation, and orientation
- Offered in-person workshops in schools, at the Benny Library, at the Unitarian Church of Montreal, at the NDG Park chalet as well as at the Saint-Raymond Community Center, before the lockdown period
- Offered 2 in-person workshops in schools before March, and 6 virtual workshops for a school, community centers, and residents, in the context of Covid-19 and new health measures;
- Processed over 70 grant applications for the CDN-NDG Borough's Cloth Diaper and Feminine Hygiene Program.

Éco-quartier NDG works in the domain of urban cleanliness by encouraging citizens not to litter, respect garbage and recycling pickup schedules, properly use street garbage bins and reduce pollution from canine waste. We also promote food waste collection, nature in the City and beautification. Finally, we work with community organizations, schools and citizens to plan local clean-ups.



## BEAUTIFICATION

- The annual distribution of flowers (June). More than 750 families and 22 community groups received flowers to beautify their gardens;
- The 15th annual perennial exchange (September);
- Two beautification activities at the Racines-de-Paix composting site
- The guidance and monitoring of the 8 green lane committees in the maintenance and beautification of their lanes while respecting social distancing (cleaning chores, plantations, visits, etc.).



## CLEANLINESS

- 1 community clean-up in the skate park located on Cavendish Street;
- 1 cigarette butt Clean-Up: young people attending the Westhaven Center day camp collected thousands of cigarette butts on Somerled Avenue;
- Weekly neighborhood cleanliness inspections and follow-up with negligent owners.



The Éco-quartier NDG team looks forward to the end of the COVID-19 pandemic so we can get back to what we do best - interacting and communicating with local residents about ecological issues. important in the neighborhood and beyond! Food waste collection will expand to apartment buildings in the Loyola area in 2021, so the team will be very busy planning, packing kits, and delivering all supplies.

## NATURE IN THE CITY



- Ongoing maintenance of the St-Thomas pollinator garden;
- Participation in 3 new "Measure 17" greening projects in the district to create cooling stations and to reduce heat islands in the Walkley-Fielding and Westhaven districts;
- Promotion of the "A Tree for My Neighborhood" program, through which 97 new trees were planted on residential land in NDG;
- Follow-up with the owners of the ash trees regarding treatment options;
- A weeding activity for the garden of an apartment building on Fielding Street.

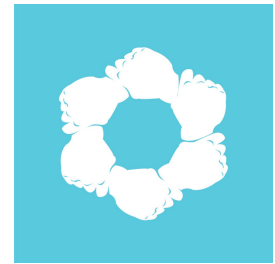

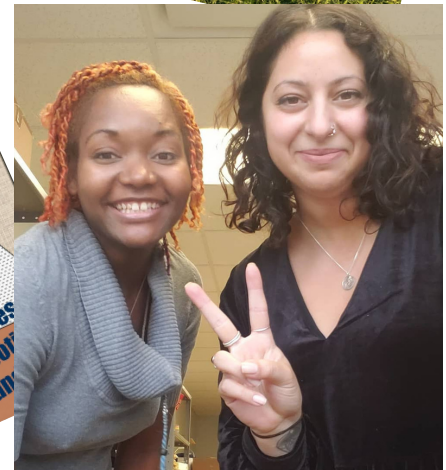
# COMMUNITY OUTREACH

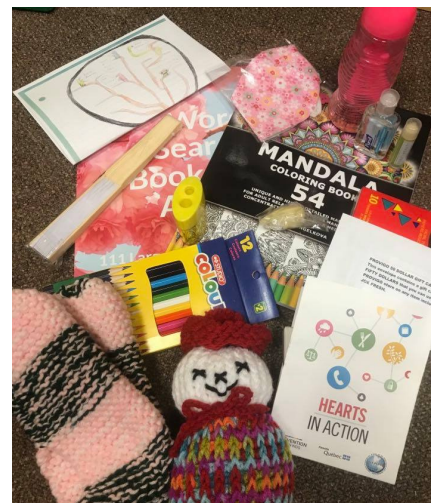


"The pandemic has drastically impacted every aspect of my role as a Street Worker for Youth. It has reduced the amount of face-to-face contact I can have with youth. It has limited the number of indoor public places and community spaces where youth usually spend their time. Luckily, the schools have remained open throughout this time and outdoor spaces such as parks remained accessible. To respond to the new reality where youth spend most of their time at home, I shifted my services to target families with kids who were struggling due to Covid-19. I delivered emergency food baskets to families that contacted me directly. I announced at the start of the pandemic that I am still available to youth by phone or by private message on social media but that if they are in crisis, I can still meet with them outdoors. I also distributed masks and hand sanitizer to youth who did not have any or lost their own." - Sarah Mekonen

## Outreach to Seniors in 2020:

- The West-End Intergenerational Network (W.I.N.), Miranda co-founded with Tracie Swim in 2017, has been able to bring the discussions to new heights on the importance of developing a more intergenerational culture through networking, promotion and with the collaboration of community group members on events and activities.
- Development of a website that will be launched in early 2021.
- Co-developed with Bruce Cameron, Gay & Grey, a social group for LGBT seniors received funding and were able to hire an outreach worker to help with further development.
- Many safe activities took place throughout the summer and continued throughout the winter season with fabulous online activities. Gay & Grey has been featured in the Gazette, CBC and Mada television. The caregiver conference which had been planned for May 2020, will be held in March of 2021.
- Thanks to the invention of Zoom, Miranda remained busy advocating for the needs of her clients on various boards and committees namely, Bienvenue a NDG, NDG Working Group on Health, Black Mental Health Connections, West-end Seniors Round Table, and One Voice.
- In November, Miranda was recruited to join the CIUSSS Cavendish User's Committee as the community representative.
- Miranda presented a program on elder abuse for the Montreal Council of Women, with powerful guest speaker Anne Caines and RECCA group (Respecting Elders: Communities Against Elder Abuse).
- Projet Sentinelles (Multicaf),
- Quartier Innovant Project (Research Center of the University Institute of Geriatrics of Montreal)
- Projet Trajectoire (Fondation Mirella et Lino Saputo)
- The Pass Less Taken Project

In partnership with NDGSCC 180 isolation breaking gift bags were assembled and distributed to 180 low income isolated seniors.

## Halte-chaueur in 2020

While the pandemic was already underway, Prevention CDN NDG launched a Warm Shelter. The pandemic has posed a challenge in terms of reception capacity, the distress encountered by users, the added need for extra hygienic measures, and the implementation of infection prevention rules.

Every evening, from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., 2 workers are present at the Halte to meet the primary needs of users (warm place to rest, meals, coffee).

The team of counselors is also present to provide active listening, to respond to immediate intervention needs, and to make referrals when possible.

We extend our gratitude to The Saint-Pascal-Baylon parish and their pastoral agent for their openness to the project and their availability.

- Prevention CDN-NDG for having set up so quickly a project necessary for the population of the neighbourhood.
- The team of workers who embarked on the project with dedication and professionalism.

- Making this resource known so that it can benefit as many people as possible.

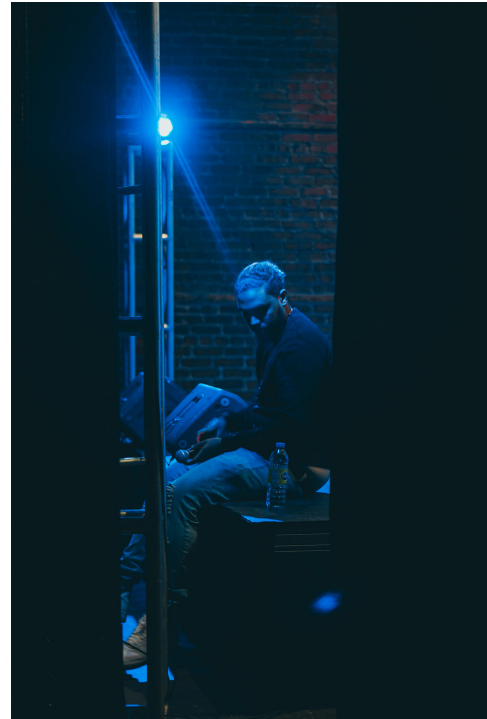


### HipHop You Don't Stop:

### Hip Hop You Don't Stop in 2020

- Series of public, free, and accessible events to create spaces of expression and exchange for youth and community members of CDN NDG in the spirit of Hip Hop culture.
- Through our social networking platforms, we informed our audience of the various community initiatives aimed at improving the quality of life in the borough.
- Provided workshops, classes, performances, public consultation sessions, mural creation, and dance competitions. - live and virtually



**Graffiti:** The mandate of our Murals service is to offer the owners of vandalized buildings or vehicles an alternative means to repair and solve the problem of graffiti and vandalism, through the services of professional artists. This section of our Urban Arts program not only adds to the beauty of the urban landscape, it also prevents vandalism. We have effectively observed that the taggers respect the fact that artists put a lot of energy into creating these pieces. This ensures that they do not vandalize the walls and vehicles on which murals were painted.



### Graffiti in 2020

- 3 activities related to the mural art program.
- Brainstorming/conceptualization workshop
- Production of the mural assisted by an emerging artist
- Opening with Band live and explanation of the mural
- Worked with the youth from the Walkley Centre on conceptualization of the Confederation Park mural

# Genders & Equality

Educating local youth, girls and boys, about subjects such as exploitation and sexual violence and issues related to gender stereotypes and equality. This project has been made possible by the joint efforts of Prevention CDN-NDG and the Table de concertation jeunesse Côte-des-Neiges.



## Genders and equality in 2020

Objectives of the branch:  
Since 2010, the Gender and Equality department offers a range of workshops and services aimed at enhancing self-esteem, empowerment and critical thinking skills in youth allowing them to thrive and reach their full potential without being limited by their gender.

- Created Training Toolkit for Caregivers
- Social network information on sexual violence among youth in Quebec
- Participation in discussion panels within various institutions and community groups (e.g. Table jeunesse Outremont, Canadian Women's Foundation, MVESV)
- Intervention guide.
- Instagram game on sexual consent
- Development of a toolkit to train school and community workers on possible courses of action in the area of sexual harassment and sexual violence.
- An online game on sexual consent for youth aged 12 to 17 years old in Quebec (Nearly 2000 subscribers).
- Launch of the project website with various tools and definitions.
- Participation in the Édusex Coalition campaign.
- Participation as a panelist in Canadian Women's Foundation training workshops.
- Creation of an engaged mural on consent with the youth of the Maison des jeunes d'Outremont (focus group) and the artist Moule.



## PREVENTION OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE

Raising awareness among young people aged 12 to 17 in CDN-NDG about sexual victimization and the different forms of control (manipulation/ blackmail) in interpersonal relationships online and offline, and creating safe and emancipatory spaces for young people that promote positive identity building in order to reduce their vulnerability to sexual exploitation. The project has two components: outreach work and prevention workshops
